It was a most relaxing and enjoyable afternoon of music when PAUL HENDON (leader, reeds) Jo Bloomfield [keyboards] Dave Burrows (acoustic guitar) Andrew Shaw (bass) Rodney Forde (drums, vocals) entertained with the Tribute to Benny Goodman. Benny's feature song "Don't Be That Way" opened the musical floodgates for "Lady Be Good" [wonderful solos from all the members], "The World Is Waiting For The Sunrise" then vocals from Rodney "Moonglow", "Makin' Whoopee" and a cha cha version of "Honeysuckle Rose". A rousing "Avalon" finished the first set. A breather for the musicians, the dancers and the audience. 2nd set started with "Jersey Bounce" a lovely ballad "A Nightingale Sang in Berkley Square" and a smile on Rodney's face as he sang Garner's "Misty" and "On the Sunny Side of the Street". A few short words then a lively "Just You Just Me" led into a slow bossa by Jobim." Moonlight in Vermont" nicely sung also gave way then for tenor sax Mark Henry to weave a soulful solo. Tadd Dameron's and Georgie Fame's "On a Warm Misty Night" sent a few goosebumps around the audience when Hetty sang this jazz classic. Then a wow!! "Get Out Of Town" Hetty really told us she can swing with the best. I must mention on Hetty's group of the best of the best musicians who were given lots of solo time. Dave on drums, Mark on reeds, Helen on bass, Bruce on guitar. Not forgetting Ben our sound man who is also the best. Then the 2nd set. White Christmas – sundry facts

The first public performance of the song was by Bing on his radio show, The Kraft Music Hall on Christmas a few weeks after the attack on Pearl Harbour. subsequently recorded the song May 29, 1942, and it leased on July 30 as part of a 78 rpm set. At first, not see anything special about the song. He just said, think we have any problems with that one, Irving."

The song established that there could be commercially successful secular Christmas songs, in this case, written by a Jewish im-migrant to the United States. Before 1942, Christmas songs and films had come out sporadically, and many were popular. However, after the success of *White Christmas* and the film where it appeared, *Holiday Inn*, the song changed Christmas music forever.

White Christmas is the most-recorded Christmas song with over 500 recorded versions, in several different languages. Frank Sinatra 1944, Jo Stafford 1946, Louis Armstrong 1954, The Bert Kaempfert Orchestra 1963, Elvis Presley 1957, Etype Jazz 2001.

Is crooning a form of jazz? It is epitomized by jazz vocalists such as Crosby and Sinatra, although Sinatra claimed that he did not consider himself or Crosby to be "crooners". What do you think?

The most covered pop song in history is widely considered to be *Yesterday* by The Beatles, (estimates of 2,200 + recorded versions).
