### **REVIEW - CAXTON STREET JAZZ BAND 10 DECEMBER 2023**

*The audience at the Caloundra Power Boat Club Function Room on Sunday 10th December eagerly awaited the entrance and opening song from the Celebrated CAXTON ST. JAZZ BAND. The CSJB need no introduction. Their music ranges from Ragtime, Classic jazz standards and Ellington. Bernice on keyboards sang a delightful "My Hearts Delight" leading into the soulful "Black and Tan Fantasy". Chris and Bernice duet "Baby What Do You Want Me To Do" which gave free soloing to all the group. Lots of applause when a fast Red Rider was played. John on trumpet played a moving solo for the Duke's "In My Solitude". A little "Jingle Bells" finished the first set. A fast "Joe Newman's Blues" settled the crowd into "Puttin' on the Ritz", "Things Ain't What They Used To Be" a frantic "Running Wild" from Bernice then the Acker Bilk "Stranger On The Shore" from Paul on Clarinet. Always a crowd favourite. A special bass solo from Andrew "Careless Love". The final has to come and a stirring "Choo Choo Ch'boogie" from Bernice segued into an encore as always. Ben our sound man did his usual great sound control.*

### **REVIEW - MOJO WEBB - CHICAGO BLUES CELEBRATION 21 JANUARY 2024**

*Think of Chicago Blues performers in the 50-60's, then Muddy Waters, Buddy Guy, Howlin' Wolf, and Hound Dog Taylor were some of the best. Not to be outdone on Sunday 21st January, we had MOJO WEBB keyboard, guitar, vocals, (what a voice!!!), and his band of great showmen, JON (bass, vocals), DAN (Guitar), JB (Guitar), COOJEE (drums), GREG (Harmonica and vocals) tell us what Chicago Blues is all about. A slow "Chicken Shack" gave Greg his chance to inform that "Champagne and Reefer" is a good combination!!!!. "Wild About You Baby", "Fattening Frogs", "Streamlined Woman" were some great blues in the first set. Second set opened with "Good Morning Blues" then the blues got downright mean and dirty. Great stuff for listenin', tappin' the toes, or jumpin' around on the floor. It was a "Damn Shame" and "I got my Mojo Working" finished the afternoon. Ben on sound did his usual masterly sound control. An afternoon to remember!! Close the eyes and you are Chicago bound!!*

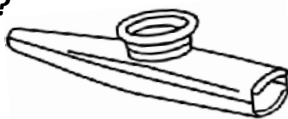
### VP's ramblings

#### Billie Holiday (Lady Day) (1915 – 1959)

*Though men seem to dominate the jazz scene Billie Holiday is considered by many to have been one of the most important jazz vocalists of the twentieth century. Her difficult life of poverty, abusive relationships, and drug abuse helped give her voice a deep, raw emotion that was expressed in her singing. By the age of fourteen, Holiday was a prostitute in New York's Harlem. After a brief period by singing in actress Billie day. When she and her mother were in jail for prostitution, Holiday escaped that life by singing in actress Billie day. She changed her name, choosing her first name after movie actress Billie day. In 1933 John Hammond heard Holiday sing and arranged for her debut that year. She sang the Scotch, sold five thousand copies and by 1935, Holiday had signed with Brunswick Records. She teamed with Bandleader Teddy Wilson and produced many jazz hits. Later she reconnected with jazz saxophonist Lester Young, who referred to her as "Lady Day".*



*After 1940, Holiday began to record ballads such as Lover Man, Don't Explain, and Good Morning Heartache. She performed at venues such as a sold-out Carnegie Hall in 1948 and later that year starred in a Broadway musical titled Holiday on Broadway. Yet her success was not enduring. Holiday's last major hit, Fine and Mellow, was released in 1957. By then, the years of addiction had taken a toll on her body and voice.*

*When Billie Holiday was in hospital dying of cirrhosis, the police tried a bedside arrest for heroin possession. Holiday won four Grammy Awards, all of them posthumously.*
