## **PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT TO 31 DECEMBER 2021**

*Good morning, and welcome to all, and once again, my thanks for your attendance today, for the Annual General Meeting of Sunshine Coast Jazz Club Inc, for year ended 31 December, 2021.*

*Sadly, we said 'Goodbye' to Ted (Red Sox) O'Connor, our Co-Founder of the club and recently appointed Patron. Ted passed away in March and with the blessing of the family, we held a wake for him, with musicians and friends joining us at Caloundra Power Boat Club where a very memorable 'jam session' was to highlight the day – Ted would have been so very proud!*

*Your Management Committee did have a change in 2021, with the resignation of our Vice President, Ray Hoeschler, who had been the 'Master of the Ship' steering the second Youth'n Jazz Bursary, and who was very much missed in seeing the culmination of his work when the judging of 8 very talented young people was held at a special "Family Day" in August. Rick Best and his band "The Day Trippers" provided backing while Rick gave invaluable assistance to the entrants in the lead up to the event. It was indeed a very difficult job for judges, Elaine Horsfield, Trevor Chalk and Brian Fane, to make final selections and I thank them all so very much for their assistance – winner of vocal section was Emily Davies and Instrumental section Joel Sanchez-Carn – there can only be one winner of the first prize money, but in my opinion, they were all winners and our future jazz is in safe hands.*

*The AGM in March 2022, sees two more valued members of Management Committee stepping down to take different paths in life – Richard Weston who many have come to know and love as our Bookings & Front of House Manager (and a bit of a 'jitter bug fan') – Richard and his wife Lynn, many may not know, were also founding members of this club along with Ted and others. Also leaving us is Lyn Vanderwolf, hard working behind the scenes, Secretary – Lyn also handled the Membership Register as well as monitoring the web site for show bookings. This has kept her very busy, as memberships continue to increase or renew, and bookings on the web are becoming more familiar to people.*

*I take this opportunity to personally paying tribute and thanking Lyn and Richard for their hard work for the club, as I do for all members of Management Committee, Treasurer Fran Kosenko, Pat Brennan – PR/Media (and photographer), Alan Horsfield – VP, Jules Verity – Web Administrator & Facebook, Wal the tireless & clever Videographer, Janey (Queen of Raffles Sales) – I could never forget to thank Brian Fane for his jazzy band reviews (sometimes done from "ghostly afar!") and all of our wonderful Volunteers – without them we could not possibly operate at the standard for which we have become known. I wish both Richard and Lyn and their partners, well for the future. The new nominees for these management positions will have big boots to fill and I remind you that volunteers are always needed and welcomed.*

*Earlier in 2021, COVID was still impacting on our shows – number restrictions were overcome by holding 2 shows each Third Sunday to make it viable to bring you "The Best of the Best" and when we could drop back to one show we 'managed' – I think the hardest thing (apart from the rush to pack down, and reset for two shows) was the wearing of masks and days of 'no dancing' – the "Double Vaccination" ruling did pay a toll on some members who chose a different path - this had included our great sound man, Ben, but as he did*

*finally succumb to COVID he now has an indemnity so we have him back for the March show.*

*When I was offered the opportunity, I could not refuse to hold an extra show (one of only two in Qld) in November starring the Legend Wilma Reading supported by Rick Best and Sweet Thunder Big Band – what a fabulous lady and what a day! Another memorable day was the Mother’s Day special, when, people came from near and far to enjoy The Andrews Sisters Tribute and Miller Horns – a sell out for this show and of course Brisbane Big Band with Lyn Rogers who are back for the 2022 March show by popular request.*

*I continue to look for new bands, and a variety in the type of jazz we present, but always keeping in mind – even if I do have to ‘blow the budget’ - which is sometimes necessary to afford the best – it will be really great jazz, and Management Committee have been very supportive of this. Sometimes it may be a while between your favorites returning but I hope to compensate that with new faces.*

*We have had extra expenses in overheads, which brought about the need for the small increase in entry to shows, but we will keep to that entry fee – even when the band costs are greater and if we do ‘blow the budget’..*

*With the changes in Management Committee, we decided to defer the Youth’nJazz Bursary until 2023 to give the new committee a chance to get settled in, but do hope it will become a bi-annual affair.*

*Finally, I would like to thank the Caloundra Power Boat Club for their support – especially Priscilla and Suzi and all staff, my husband John, who puts in the hard yards with me, our volunteers – and please remember – we are all volunteers – but especially Management Committee, Ben our sound man, the bands for your talent and friendship, and last, but certainly not least, YOU THE MEMBERS for your continued support and friendship. My congratulations to the newly elected committee for the coming year and looking forward to enjoying great jazz with you.*

### *The Glenn Miller Mystery -*

*Speculation and misinformation are not new.*

*Popular big band leader Glenn Miller lost his life in a plane crash during the Second World War. To this day, the exact cause of the fatal crash and the death of those on the plane with him remains a mystery. Some even believed the story of a plane crash was a cover story for a more sordid end. Wild theories abounded about Miller's fate. The most prominent theories over the years:*

- Miller never boarded the plane but was assassinated after Gen. Eisenhower sent him on a secret mission one or two days earlier to negotiate a surrender from Nazi Germany.*
- He made it to Paris, where he died of a heart attack in a bordello.*
- The small plane he was on was destroyed by bombs jettisoned from a phalanx of Allied bombers passing overhead on their way back from an aborted mission over Germany.*
- He had been imprisoned and tortured to death by the Nazis (an old favourite).*

*Although he had recorded under his own name for several years Miller struggled to establish himself as a musician and bandleader. He formed his own orchestra (1935) and reconfigured it several times looking for a winning arrangement. It was his band's gig at the famed Glen Island Casino in New York (1939) that helped put Miller on the map. This provided much public radio play.*

*Miller's first hit was Wishing (1939). He penned a more successful single, Moonlight Serenade, which also climbed the 1939 charts. Between 1939 and 1942 the Glenn Miller Orchestra enjoyed amazing popularity and commercial success. They dominated the music charts with over 60 top hits, including Miller's signature song In the Mood in 1940. With their distinctive swing-jazz style, Miller's orchestra became the country's top dance band.*

*Miller led the US Army Air Force Band, which entertained the troops during WWII. He was stationed in England in 1944 when told his band was to go to Paris. On December 15, Miller boarded a transport plane headed to the newly liberated French capital. He had plans for a new series of concerts but he never arrived.*

*What happened to Miller's plane was a mystery.*

*Seventy years on, the mystery of his disappearance may have a plausible explanation. A researcher claims he can put to rest decades of conjecture surrounding the mysterious disappearance of Miller during World War II.*

*Long overlooked military documents indicate the small plane in which Miller was likely traveling when he disappeared in 1944 probably crashed in the English Channel after fuel intakes froze. The icing took three forms: engine icing, carburettor icing and induction ice. What do you believe?*
