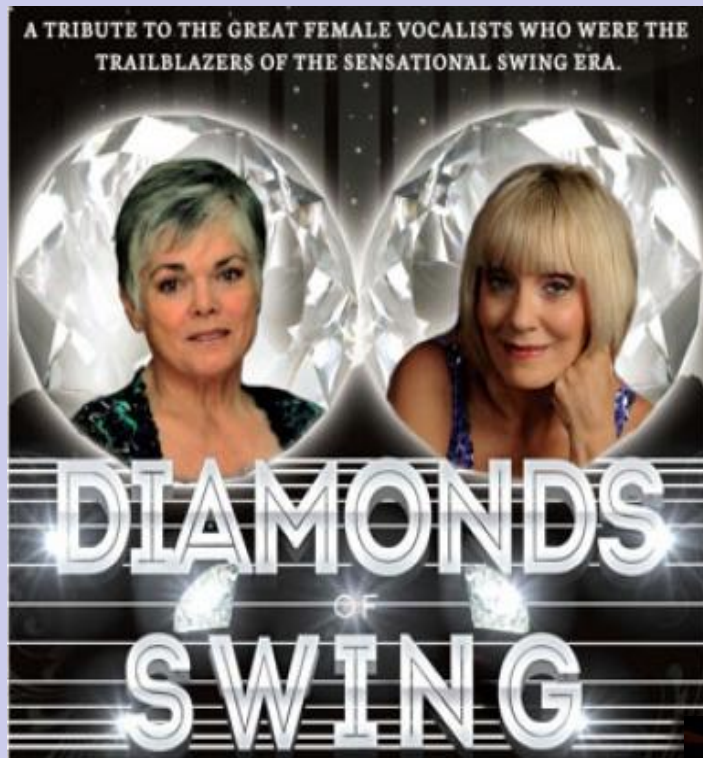

# - REVIEW -

## A MAN AND HIS PIANO



On Sunday 28<sup>th</sup> August “A MAN AND HIS PIANO” was presented by Australian (now residing in New York) pianist MR. MATT BAKER. A more apt title could not be improved on.

Matt opened his solo recital with ‘Just Squeeze Me’ followed by ‘Someone in Love’, ‘Autumn in New York’ and then a hauntingly soft rendition of “In the Wee Small Hours”. The audience’ silence during this solo was held for a few moments then a thunderous applause followed.



Matt played melodies from his latest CD “Almost Blue” as well as singing this glorious Elvis Costello song. Having known and listened to Matt for over 15 years or more it was a pleasure to hear the development, the technique, the improvisations that have evolved during this period.

During this solo there were elements of Bach's Fugues where each hand is playing different themes and giving an impression that maybe there are two pianists and not one.

Featured were songs composed by Oscar Peterson and Dave Brubeck and they were given empathetic renditions for the appreciative audience. The theme from the movie “The Apartment” was Matt's encore and is featured twice on “ALMOST BLUE” as the story reflects part of Matt's life.



Matt spoke of his friendship with Oscar Peterson, the long nights playing in small clubs, arriving home in the early morning hours, doing the “Hard Yards” until now his name and music is being rec-

ognised by the critical New York Jazz devotees.

Thank you Matt for presenting “A MAN AND HIS PIANO”. We will welcome another performance in the not too distant future.

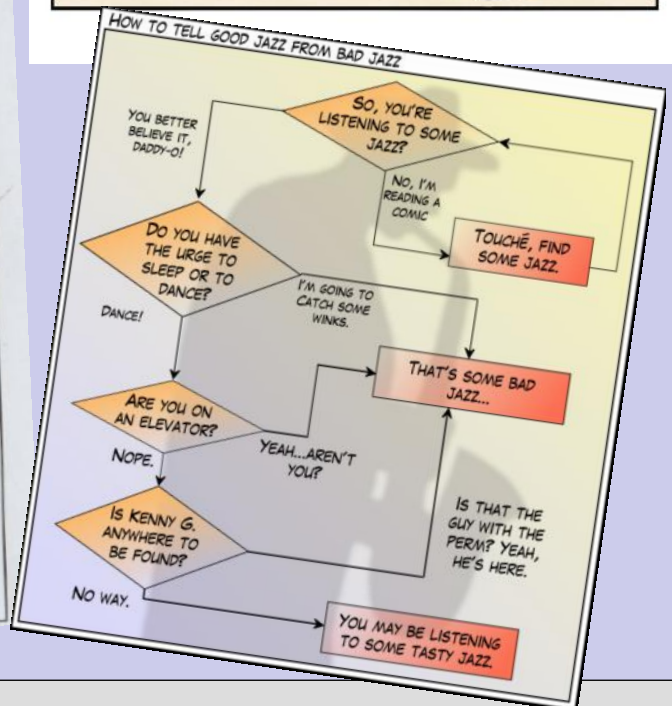

The Rabbi looked up and said:

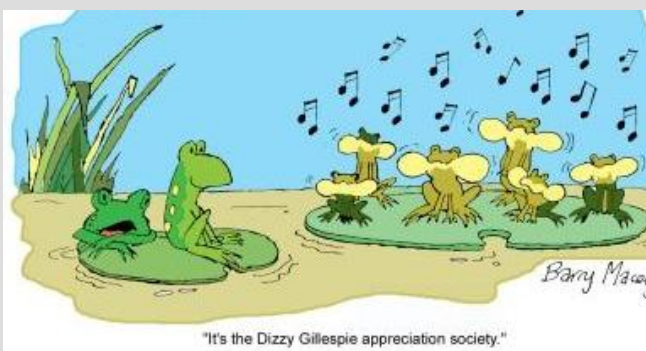
